While being a secluded and rural getaway location, the property is nevertheless in the heart of Virginia wine country, guaranteeing access to copious local attractions and events, as well as easy access to quaint towns and villages in Virginia. This property is a place of peace, tranquility and calm, somewhere to fulfill the craving to immerse oneself in mother-nature.

Lot 3A lies toward the rear and is perked for a 6-bedroom house and would make a great homesite or, if purchased with lots 3C and 3B, has potential for a B&B or family compound. The possibilities are endless.

Lot 3B features a quaint cottage of 873 square feet on just under 4 acres. It makes for an ideal weekend getaway and offers the opportunity to be expanded upon as the septic field is 'perked' for 2 bedrooms, with an additional 4-bedroom perk site approved for a main home.

Lot 3C (1 and 2) sits closest to Ada Road and has been identified to have one potential family subdivision, meaning that the current 4 acres may qualify to be split into two 2-acre lots as seen on the attached plat. One of the 2-acre lots already has an installed septic field, perked for a 2-bedroom house, plus has an additional 3-bedroom perk, while the second 2-acre lot is perked for a 5-bedroom house.

Ingress/egress

At present, access to lots 3C, 3B and 3A are all via the gravel road which starts at Ada Road, and currently ends at the small cottage on lot 3B. Ultimately, 3A and 3B should be accessed by extending Walden Lane, a right of way ingress/egress easement for which has been deeded (shown on the plat), but which future lot/homeowners will need to have extended to their properties. 3C could also be accessed via Walden Lane, or the existing gravel road.

General:

- ❖ All three lots are available to purchase either separately, or together as one.
- With the excellent draining soils, mature redwoods, streams, pond-site and extensive 'perking' of the combined lots, there are endless possibilities.

About the area:

Despite being utterly rural, the property is within easy reach of suburban Washington D.C. and nestled in Fauquier County, an area which has been carefully controlling urban sprawl, with a focus on conservation.

Directions:

From I-66 take Free State Road for 3.2 miles - right on Ada Rd for 600 feet - left up a gravel road.
